

TOWN OF DEERFIELD

MONTHLY MEETING, MONDAY, MARCH 9, 2020, 7:00 P.M.

The town board meeting was called to order at 7:00 P.M. with all officers present.

A motion was made by Randy Behlke, seconded by Nick Brattlie to move item 12 of the agenda to item 6 for quicker consideration. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Randy Behlke, seconded by Dan Kelly to approve the February minutes. Motion carried.

Mr. Josh Sewell, Deerfield fire chief, Mr. Doug Quam, representative for Rosenbauer Co., and several Deerfield fire dept. representatives, were present to request that the Town of Deerfield consider the purchase of a new fire truck to replace Squad 5, a 1997 Freightliner. Total cost for the new truck would be \$327,447.00 with a build out time frame of thirteen months with a 25 year life expectancy. The new truck would also be built on a Freightliner chassis. Randy Behlke made a motion, seconded by Mike Schlobohm, to recommend the approval for purchase of the new truck. Motion carried unanimously.

The Dane County Sheriff Dept. representative was present to update the town regarding recent past activity within the township. The town was also informed of the dept.'s hiring of a part time crisis worker for families in need of counseling.

The town temporarily adjourned the monthly meeting to open a public hearing for the purpose of consideration of the final draft of the town's new land use policy. Mr. Ben Rohr, Vandewalle & Assc. was present to inform the public that the last town land use policy was done in 2007 and this one should be good till 2030 with the addition also of a TDR policy to go along with land use guidelines. No other questions were posed by the public. The board adjourned the public hearing to go back into the regular monthly meeting.

On a motion by Bill Roelofs, seconded by Randy Behlke, the board unanimously agreed to adopt Ordinance 2020-2 Town of Deerfield Comprehensive Plan. Motion carried. A special thanks from the town board was extended to Jim Maple and Korby Holzhueter for all their work and commitment in completion of the project.

Discussion of the garbage collection contract was tabled.

On a motion by Bill Roelofs, seconded by Randy Behlke, the town board agreed to a heading reorganization of the revenues and expenses monthly report. Motion carried.

The town board agreed to move forward with the WI. State 90-10 road program for Oak Park Rd. with the monies of \$218,000.00 granted by the state for the app. 300,000.00 plus project.

The board agreed to move forward in conjunction with the village on a rfp. for completion by 2022 of the Liberty Rd. Project with an estimated town out of pocket cost of 70-80,000.00 dollars.

On a motion by Nick Brattlie, seconded by Randy Behlke, the treasurer's report and a general fund voucher of \$36,343.41 was accepted. Motion carried.
